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**THIS IS AN IMPORTANT LEGAL DOCUMENT. BEFORE SIGNING IT,
YOU SHOULD KNOW THESE IMPORTANT FACTS:**

Pursuant to the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act (RSA 291-A) there are several other methods to document your intention to make an anatomical gift besides this form:

- by signing a donor card,
- by indicating on your driver's license (pursuant to RSA 263:41) or
- by indicating in your Will.

You must be of sound mind and 18 years of age or older at the time you document your gift. You, as the donor, must sign this form. If you are unable to sign, you must direct two witnesses to sign for you in your presence, and in the presence of each other.

If you make your document of gift on your driver's license and it is subsequently revoked, suspended or cancelled, your document of gift is *not invalidated*.

The gift takes effect at death, whether or not your Will is probated. If you make your document of gift in your Will and it is declared invalid, your document of gift is *unaffected*. If you make your document of gift in your Will, you may change it only by executing a new Will or codicil. If your document of gift is *not* made by Will you may amend or revoke it by a signed statement, or by any communication to a physician or surgeon made during terminal illness or injury.

If your anatomical gift is not revoked at your death, it becomes irrevocable, and does not require consent of any person to be acted upon. Unless otherwise indicated, an anatomical gift of one part is not a refusal or limitation on the gift of remaining parts.
